## A SURVEY OF AMERICA'S PHYSICIANS: <br> PRACTICE PATTERNS AND PERSPECTIVES

## RESPONSES FROM THE STATE OF TEXAS

Following are responses from the state of Texas to a national survey of physicians commissioned by The Physicians Foundation and conducted by Merritt Hawkins. Of 13,575 survey responses, $8.7 \%$ (or some 1,180 responses) were from physicians in Texas. Responses of Texas physicians are compared to all survey responses.
