TMA Distinguished Service Award

🔆 TMA Honors Dr. Alan C. Baum

The recipient of this year's Distinguished Service Award is Alan C. Baum, MD, an ophthalmologist in private practice since 1973. Dr. Baum has been an inspiration to friends and colleagues, who have witnessed his devotion to medicine and quality patient care.

At the local, state, and national levels, Dr. Baum has provided outstanding leadership to the medical profession, demonstrating meritorious achievement in medical science, public service, and service to the medical community, as recognized by this award.

Dr. Baum has served as president of the Texas Medical Association and chair of TEXPAC, as well as serving on innumerable councils and boards of TMA and the Harris County Medical Society (HCMS). He has had a remarkable tenure as a Harris County Delegate to the TMA Delegation, including chair of the HCMS Medical Legislative Board and the Harris County Delegation, of which he has been a member since 1978.

His service includes president of the Texas Ophthalmological Association (TOA) and numerous other leadership positions. He has received many awards including the Ashbel Smith Distinguished Alumnus Award, the TOA Distinguished Service Award, the TMA Young Physician Section's Young at Heart Award, and the TMA Medical Student Section's C. Frank Webber, MD, Award.

Under his direction as chair of the TMA Board of Trustees, the association moved to its current headquarters building on West 15th Street in 1991. He promoted TMA's endorsement of the Texas Medical Liability Trust (TMLT) in 1992 and appointed a TMA/TMLT Liaison Committee to focus on tort reform and medical liability. In 1997, he oversaw the selection of current EVP/CEO, Louis Goodman.

A longtime philanthropist, Dr. Baum has contributed not only monetary donations but, more important, donations of time to numerous causes. He currently serves on the Advisory Council of the Texas Medical Association Foundation and has been a member of its Leadership Society since 2010.

In his more than 40 years of service, Dr. Baum has been a tenacious steward of the preservation of American medicine. He has devoted a major portion of his career to the Federation of Medicine, representing his colleagues and patients at every turn. There is no doubt that his dedication to organized medicine, education, and the legislative arena has left a legacy for future physicians and their patients.

Zubin Damania, MD, is the director of health care development for Downtown Project Las Vegas, an ambitious urban revitalization movement spearheaded by Zappos.com CEO Tony Hsieh. During his 10-year hospitalist career at Stanford, Dr. Damania received the Russell Lee Award for Clinical Teaching while simultaneously maintaining a shadow career performing stand-up comedy for medical audiences worldwide. His videos, created under the pseudonym ZDoggMD, have amassed over one million views, focusing on educating patients and providers alike while mercilessly satirizing our dysfunctional health care system. In Las Vegas, Dr. Damania is making the leap from satire to actionable change by implementing an innovative model of health

care delivery that promotes wellness at both the individual and community level. With an emphasis on prevention, Turntable Health opened its first primary care clinic December 2013.

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Fort Worth: Around Town



Sundance Square

Downtown Fort Worth has gained a reputation as one of the country's liveliest urban settings. The 35-squareblock Sundance Square entertainment district is home to restaurants, live music clubs, theatres, shops, exciting nightlife, and the beautiful Bass Performance Hall, named one of the top 10 opera houses in the world.

Cowtown Segway Tours

Fort Worth's original Segway Tour Company is now open downtown. Located in the historic Barber's Bookstore building, Cowtown Segway Tours brings a full line of world-class personal transporters for guided tours of downtown. Glide around Fort Worth's Trinity Park, the downtown area, or the Stockyards on your personal segway.

Fort Worth Museum of Science and History

Nestled in the Fort Worth Cultural District, the museum boasts a variety of traveling and permanent exhibitions. Permanent exhibits include DinoLabs and DinoDig, Energy Blast, Fort Worth Children's Museum, and the Cattle Raisers Museum, a "museum within a museum." Children under the age of 12 can experience Innovation Studios — five glass-walled studios that house Inventor, Doodler, Designer, Imaginer, and Explorer. This hands-on area is where imagination, curiosity, and creativity are encouraged and nurtured. The museum is also home to the Omni IMAX Theater and the Noble Planetarium.

Kids can learn how to round 'em up and move 'em out at Texas Wild!, a hands-on exhibit that showcases the unique wildlife of the Lone Star State and includes a petting zoo. Visit all four great ape species in the 2.5-acre world of primates or get eye-to-eye with some of the most endangered reptiles and amphibians on the planet at the Museum of Living Art.

Amon Carter Museum of American Art

Designed by renowned architect Philip Johnson, the Amon Carter Museum of American Art houses a permanent collection of 19th- and 20th-century paintings, sculptures, and works on paper, and is one of the nation's major repositories of American photography. It is also home to nearly 400 works by Frederic Remington and Charles M. Russell, the two greatest artists of the American West.

Six Flags Over Texas

Located 15 miles from downtown Fort Worth in Arlington, Six Flags Over Texas is a 212-acre park featuring awesome rides, great shows, and incredible attractions. Six Flags has more than 50 rides; you'll find everything from Looney Tunes rides for youngsters to nerve-numbing thrill machines like SUPERMAN: Tower of Power and Texas Giant.

Stockyards Championship Rodeo and Pawnee Bill's Wild West Show

Every Friday and Saturday night at 8 pm, the Stockyards Championship Rodeo at Cowtown Coliseum in the Stockyards National Historic District features bull riding, barrel racing, calf roping and more. Pawnee Bill's Wild West show, a reenactment of the original Wild West show, provides a look at Western history, including trick shooting, roping, riding, and cowboy songs.
