Subject:           Establishing Reasonable Statute of Limitation for Administrative Issues Under  
                          Jurisdiction of the Texas Medical Board

1   Whereas, The statute of limitations runs two years for most civil issues in the State of Texas; and

3   Whereas, The Texas Medical Board has jurisdiction over infractions of the Texas Medical Practice Act  
4   and rules promulgated by the board under that act; and  
5  
6   Whereas, The board has streamlined its approach to administrative infractions; and  
7  
8   Whereas, The board has set no statute of limitations, even for the most minor infractions of rules and  
9   regulations under the act; and  
10  
11   Whereas, Physicians deserve the same protection under the law as all other Texas citizens; therefore be it  
12  
13   RESOLVED, That the Texas Medical Association seek relief for its members by encouraging the Texas  
14   Medical Board to enact a reasonable statute of limitations for administrative violations appropriate to the  
15   offense.
