

***Texas Medicine* Conflict of Interest Policy**

A conflict of interest may be considered to exist where the actions or activities of authors or third parties may involve obtaining an improper personal gain or advantage from publication of an article. Any conflict or potential conflict must be disclosed in writing to the Chair of the *Texas Medicine* Editorial Committee and to the Editor of *Texas Medicine*. They will determine if the conflict or potential conflict is sufficient to preclude publication of the article.

All authors of Journal articles must sign the following statement and return it to: *Texas Medicine*, 401 W. 15th St., Austin, TX 78701

1. I have participated sufficiently in the work to take public responsibility for the content.
2. I have made substantial contributions to the conception, design or analysis and interpretation of data.
3. I have made substantial contributions to drafting the article or revising it critically for important intellectual content.
4. I have given final approval of the version of the article to be published.
5. I certify that the manuscript represents valid work and that neither this manuscript nor one with substantially similar content under my authorship has been published or is being considered for publication elsewhere, except as described in an attachment.
6. I attest that, if requested by the editors, I will provide the data or will cooperate fully in obtaining and providing the data on which the manuscript is based for examination by the editors or their assignees.
7. I certify that all my affiliations with or financial involvement (eg; employment, consultancies, honoraria, stock ownership or options, expert testimony, grants or patents received or pending, royalties) with any organization or entity with a financial interest in or in financial competition with the subject matter or materials discussed in the manuscript are completely disclosed below or in an attachment.
8. I certify that all financial and material support for this research and work is clearly identified in the manuscript.

Group Authorship. If authorship is attributed to a group, all members of the group must meet the full criteria and requirements for authorship described in the above paragraphs. A group may designate one or more authors to take responsibility for the group, in which case the other group members are not authors, but may be listed in an acknowledgment.
