TMA Leadership College is supported by an educational grant from The Physicians Foundation. The Physicians Foundation is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) national organization that seeks to advance the work of practicing physicians and to improve the quality of health care for all Americans.

Program Guidelines

- Applicants must be an active TMA member and under the age of 40 or in the first eight years of practice.
- The TMALC Executive Committee will review all applications, references, and sponsorships to compose the Class of 2016. Applicants will be notified of acceptance no later than Aug. 15, 2015.
- Scholars must be sponsored by a county medical society or state specialty society. Staff will facilitate sponsorship following receipt of applications.

Fees and Expenses

- There is no tuition fee, but scholars are required to pay their housing and travel expenses, which are estimated to be less than \$1,500. TMA provides meals and program materials during training.
- A limited number of scholarships are available to support scholar travel expenses. Priority will be given to scholars traveling outside metropolitan areas or to those demonstrating financial need. Please indicate on your application if you wish to apply.

Application and Scholar Selection Process

- Download the application at www.texmed.org/leadership or request an application be emailed to you by contacting the TMA Knowledge Center at (800) 880-7955 or knowledge@texmed.org.
- The application asks for a highlight of your leadership/management experience, along with your reasons for pursuing advanced leadership education. You'll also be asked to include two physician recommendations — references who are familiar with your leadership experience.

2015-16 SCHEDULE AT A GLANCE



Classroom programming consists of didactic lecture, case presentation, video and audio projections, question-and-answer discussion, small-group breakouts, role playing, and observation of technique/skill.

Prior to the initial class meeting, scholars will complete a Myers Briggs Type Indicator assessment, a psychometric questionnaire designed to measure psychological preferences in how people perceive the world and make decisions. This serves as an entrance into discussions about different communication styles, gaining consensus, and team building.

Scholars may earn accredited continuing medical education (CME). Additional CME opportunities are available for participating in leadership college activities at related conferences, such as TMA Fall Conference and TexMed.
