Objective 1: Protect Patient Health Information	Protect electronic health information created or maintained by the EHR. Conduct or review a security risk analysis, including addressing the encryption/security of data at rest and implement security updates as necessary. Correct identified security deficiencies as part of risk management process.	
Objective 2: Clinical Decision Support	1) Implement <u>five</u> clinical decision support interventions related to four or more clinical quality measures at a relevant point in patient care for the entire EHR reporting period. Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: Implement <u>one</u> clinical decision support rule relevant to specialty or high clinical priority, along with the ability to track compliance with that rule. 2) Enable the functionality for drug-drug and drug-allergy interaction checks for the entire EHR reporting period.	√
Objective 3: Computerized Provider Order Entry (CPOE)	Use computerized provider order entry (CPOE) for medication, laboratory and radiology orders created during the EHR reporting period. 1) More than 60% of medication orders Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: Use CPOE for more than 30% of unique patients with at least one medication in their medication list; or more than 30% of medication orders created during the EHR reporting period are recorded using CPOE. 2) More than 30% of laboratory orders Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: May claim an exclusion for laboratory orders for an EHR reporting period in 2015 3) More than 30% of radiology orders Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: May claim an exclusion for laboratory orders for an EHR reporting period in 2015	✓
Objective 4: E-prescribing	Generate, compare with at least one drug formulary, and transmit more than 50% of all permissible prescriptions. Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: Generate and transmit permissible prescriptions electronically for more than 40% of all permissible prescriptions.	√
Objective 5: Health Information Exchange	1) Use a certified EHR to create a summary of care record 2) Electronically transmit the summary of care to a receiving provider for more than 10% of transitions of care and referrals. Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: May claim an exclusion - there is no equivalent measure for Stage 1	✓
Objective 6: Patient Education	Use the EHR to identify and provide patient-specific education resources to the patient for more than 10% of all unique patients seen during the EHR reporting period. Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: May claim an exclusion if the patient education menu objective was unintentionally selected	√

Objective 7: Medication Reconciliation	Perform medication reconciliation for <u>more than 50%</u> of transitions of care in which the patient is transitioned into the care of the physician. Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: May claim an exclusion if the medication reconciliation menu objective was unintentionally selected	√	
Objective 8: Patient Electronic Access / View, Download, Transmit (VDT)	1) Provide online access within 4 business days, for more than 50% of all unique patients, to their health information. For 2015 and 2016: 2) At least one patient seen during the EHR reporting period must view, download, or transmit to a third party their health information. Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: May claim an exclusion for the second measure, which does not have an equivalent measure For 2017: 2) More than 5% of patients seen during the EHR reporting period must view, download, or transmit to a third party their health information.	√	
Objective 9: Secure patient messaging	For 2015: For an EHR reporting period, the capability for patients to send and receive a secure electronic message with the provider was fully enabled. Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: May claim an exclusion - there is no equivalent measure for Stage 1 For 2016: For at least one patient seen during the EHR reporting period, a secure message was sent using the electronic messaging function of the certified EHR, or in response to a secure message sent by the patient. For 2017: A secure message was sent using the EHR secure messaging function by more than 5% of unique patients seen during EHR reporting period.	✓	
Objective 10: Public Health Reporting	Meet at least two of the public health measures listed below: 1) Immunization Registry Reporting - Be actively engaged with a public health agency to submit immunization data. 2) Syndromic Surveillance Reporting - Be actively engaged with a public health agency to submit syndromic surveillance data. 3) Specialized Registry Reporting - Be actively engaged with a specialized registry to submit data. Physicians scheduled to demonstrate Stage 1 in 2015: Meet at least one of the public health measures listed above.	√	
Clinical Quality Measures (CQMs)	As part of meeting meaningful use, physicians must report on 9 of the 64 CMS-approved clinical quality measures (CQMs). CQMs must be submitted electronically to CMS as part of the Medicare incentive program, and to Texas Medicaid for the Medicaid incentive program.
